

Manual Handling Train the Trainer

City & Guilds Accredited Program

This 2 day practical and interactive course will provide the technical knowledge and course material to design, develop and deliver effective manual handling training.

The course concentrates on the safe handling of materials and objects (rather than people). It is suitable for industries such as manufacturing, office, construction, distribution, catering, logistics, driver CPC etc. as well as non-clinical healthcare.

The course is aimed managers and supervisors intending to carry out in-house training to their own workforce. Participants should have a good grasp of English and be literate. Previous training experience is not essential, but new trainers must be confident to stand up and speak in front of a group.

Learners will gain the following competencies:

- Be able to run training sessions on manual handling with confidence.
- Answer commonly occurring questions.
- Understand how to motivate trainees and ensure the effectiveness of the training.
- Develop a working knowledge of the anatomy of the spine.
- Appreciate the impact on the spine of both good and bad handling techniques.
- Understand and be able to explain safe handling to trainees in a logical and memorable manner.
- Understand and explain the Manual Handling Operations Regulations 1992.
- Carry out manual handling risk assessments competently.
